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## V O R B E M E R K U N

Leopold Mozart schenkte seinem Sohn Wolfgang zu dessen siebtem Geburtstag ein Notenbuch, das er aus verschiedenen Tänzen und Stücken verschiedenster Art zusammenstellte. Die Suiten sind nach Tonarten geordnet. Leopold wollte durch diese Anordnung die pädagogische Absicht, seinen Sohn in die damals gebräuchlichen musikalischen Formen und die vorliegenden Auswahl wurde diese Anordnung nach Schuberts handschriftlichen Anweisungen so verändert, dass sie für den heutigen Klavierunterricht ohne Bedeutung ist. Die leichtesten und bestens geeigneten Stücke sind in abwechselnd reicher und anregender Folge für den Gebrauch im Unterricht zusammengestellt.

Ce cahier de musique fut un cadeau du père Mozart à son fils Wolfgang à l'occasion de la 7<sup>e</sup> fête de son nom, le 31 octobre 1762. Le père souhaitait que son fils connaisse les œuvres de compositeurs contemporains, les danses et autres morceaux qui étaient alors en vogue. Les œuvres étaient classées par tonalités employées à cette époque, pour suivant ainsi l'ordre des œuvres de Bach, de Quantz et d'autres auteurs de leur époque. Ce but est dépourvu de sens, dans la mesure où les œuvres sont classées par tonalité et non pas par date. Il est donc à noter que nous n'avons pas respecté cet ordre, dans cette édition, mais nous avons au contraire classé les œuvres dans l'ordre des plus faciles et les plus belles d'une façon alternée, pour faciliter l'apprentissage et aux plaisirs du foyer.
