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Introduction

PATTERN OF FINGERING

In this book I have endeavoured to present the earliest stages of recorder playing in the simplest form. The first two fingers and the guidance of a teacher. For small hands the thumb and the use of the little finger seem almost impossible, so these facilities have been avoided. Only nursery rhymes and simple folk-songs of small size are used, and it is hoped that most of them will be familiar to every player.

The material in this book is based on my book *More Tunes for My Recorder* is arranged progressively in fingering and in music generally.

PIANO ACCOMPANIMENT

It is suggested that the PIANO (wood or keyboard) be used to accompany recorder playing at the stages, failing to rectify faulty intonation which is best done by ear and hearing. For this purpose a TEACHER'S BOOK contains piano accompaniments to all the exercises as well as the tunes themselves.

TREBLE RECORDERS *ad lib.*

A supplementary ACCOMPANIMENT for treble recorder is added for the use of the more advanced treble beginners in the same class. The same pattern of fingering is used for treble as for descant so that the two progress simultaneously.

RECORDERS WITH VIOLINS

A supplementary VIOLIN PART can be used progressively with the recorder by members of the violin class from the moment that the open strings can be played accurately with the bow. To begin with, the violin part is an accompaniment, but it gradually plays more of each tune until at the end of the book the recorder and violin are playing the melody together in octaves. It seems to be every beginner's ambition to play the tune, so let him do so, for surely, good unison playing is the foundation of good ensemble playing!


