NOTE

The editor suggests that tenor or treble (or a mixture of the two, according to the piece) should be employed. Descant voices may double at the upper octave.

The participation of other instruments to be encouraged. The editor suggests, as possibilities, lute, psaltery, bells, organ, small drum, and viols.

In performance no attempt should be made to disguise the accents implied by the regular ternary groupings.
