

The first publication of this set of six sonatas, opus 5, by Sigf. Quantz, was announced in the *General Advertiser* of 8 November 1750. That publication is here reprinted in facsimile from a copy in the present writer's collection. Despite the ascription on the title page the attribution of this set to Johann Joachim Quantz may be doubted. The engraved music text should present few problems to the modern reader. There are a few instances of missing slurs which can be easily supplied by analogy. Accidentals, unless subsequently cancelled, remain valid for the whole bar in which they appear (some accidentals are repeated within a bar in this engraving). Players should be prepared to supply cadential trills. Certain obvious engraving errors in the original copy are listed below.

Die Erstveröffentlichung dieser Sonaten aus dem Sammelopus 5 von Sigl Quantz wurde am 8. November 1750 in der *General Advertiser* angekündigt. Die vorliegende Edition ist ein Faksimile eines Exemplars, das sich in meinem Besitz befindet. Trotz der Zuordnung im Titelblatt zu Johann Joachim Quantz zweifelhaft. Der genaue Verfasser ist nicht mehr bestimmbar. Die Fehler im Druck stellen für den Leser kaum Probleme aufwerfen. In ein paar Fällen kann die Korrektur durch Vergleich mit analogen Stellen leicht ergründet werden. Einzelne Fehler, die nicht wiederanzuhören sind, gelten jeweils für alle Stimmen des Systems. In diesem Falle werden einige Korrekturen (in Klammern) in der Notation eingeführt.


