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# Vorwort

Dieses Heft wendet sich an Klavierpädagogen und Schüler, die sich neben dem „klassischen“ Unterricht einen Einblick in die Melodik, Harmonik und Spielpraxis des Jazz oder jazzigen Landler-Musik verschaffen möchten. Dabei knüpft gleich das erste Stück – bitte entschuldigen Sie den Autor dieser kleinen Parodie nachsehen – an die Etüdenpraxis des technischen Studiums an, die aber hier rhythmisch und harmonisch-melodisch aufgelockert erscheint. Die letzten Stücke gehören bereits in die Stilistik des „modernen Jazz“, und können als Improvisationsgrundlage für die moderne Stilrichtung verwandt werden. In dem Notentext sind die Harmoniesymbole beigegeben, wie sie in den American-Jazz-Titeln verwendet werden, sodass dadurch eine Begleitung mit Bass und Gitarre möglich wird. Statt #5 wird + für die übermäßige Quinte verwendet; eine 9 schafft die Achtung (wenn nicht anders vermerkt), ebenso ermöglicht die 7 eine zusätzliche 9.

This book is intended for piano teachers and students who, in addition to their 'classical' tuition, want to learn something about melodic writing, harmonic progressions and performance practice in jazz or jazz-influenced music. The very first piece – please forgive the author this little parody – goes under the heading of technical studies, adding some more relaxed rhythms and playing around with melodic and harmonic details.

The last few pieces reflect the stylistic tendencies of modern jazz and may be used as a basis for improvisation in this style. The music includes harmonic symbols such as are used in American jazz tunes, allowing for bass and guitar accompaniment to be added. Rather than #5, + is used for an augmented fifth; a 9 assumes the inclusion of 7 (unless otherwise stipulated), while a 7 allows for the addition of a 9.
