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## Preface

The word *argorū* comes from the Ghanaian Twi language and means "to play." ARGORU I for piano is the first in a series of virtuoso pieces for solo instruments, including cello, flute, viola, bass clarinet, alto flute, marimba, vibraphone and snare drum. To play ARGORU I, the performer must be prepared to explore complex rhythmic and melodic gestures, sudden shifts of dynamics and range. The melodic lines bounce along like a trampoline, only to be interrupted by clusters that serve as tonal pillars. The material is presented in a variety of climaxes in a burst of controlled improvisation. An intellectually rigorous work, ARGORU nevertheless maintains a playfulness and spontaneity. ARGORU I was composed for pianist Lea Bissell and was premiered on May 1, 1970 in Sprague Hall at the University of Missouri.

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## Vorwort

Das Wort „argoru“ kommt aus dem Dialekt Twi, welcher in Ghana gesprochen wird, und übersetzt schlicht „spielen“ bedeutet. ARGORU I für Klavier ist der erste Teil einer Serie virtuoser Stücke für Soloinstrumente, wie Cello, Flöte, Viola, Bassklarinette, Altflöte, Marimba, Vibraphon und kleine Trommel. Um ARGORU I zu spielen muss der Ausführende bereit sein, komplexe Rhythmen, sowie manchmal unerwartete melodische Linien springen vorüber, wie atonale Jazz-züge, die von einem Ton zum anderen unterbrochen werden, welche als tonale Säulen die Melodie des Werks bestimmen. Ein gedanklich rigoroses Werk, gleichwohl ARGORU I durchwegs überraschend und Ungezwungenheit enthält. ARGORU I wurde am 2. Februar 1970 von mir komponiert und am 1. Mai 1970 in der Sprague Memorial Hall in Accra, Ghana aufgeführt.
